The International Folk Music Council has pleasure in announcing that its Eighteenth Conference will be held from July 26 to August 4, 1966, at the University of Ghana, Legon, Accra, by invitation of the Ghana Ministry of Art and Culture, Accra, Ghana.

THEMES

The main themes of the Conference will be:

(1) Migration of Folk Music

The migration of folk music and its effect on musical style and content. Contributions may be based on vocal or instrumental folk music, or on dance. Special attention may be given to the following areas: Africa, Arabia, the Balkans, India, the Mediterranean Region, South America, Southern Asia.

(2) Multi-Part Techniques in Folk Music and Dance

- (a) Polyphonic and polyrhythmic forms in oral musical tradition;
- (b) Polyphonic and polyrhythmic forms and their significance for the dance.

NB. In all contributions, musical examples and analyses must be included.

PAPERS

Members who wish to read a paper on either of the above themes are asked to forward to Professor Klaus Wachsmann, Department of Music, University of California, 405 Hilgard Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90024, U.S.A., not later than February 1, the title of the paper, a short summary of its contents (about 300 words), the type of illustration they wish to use, and the language of the paper.

It is emphasized that all papers should embody new facts and findings and should be based on original research.

The Programme Committee of the Conference reserves the right to refuse any paper that cannot be fitted into the scheme of the Conference. Members will be notified not later than March 31 whether their papers can be accepted or not.

Members whose papers are accepted will be asked to send the full paper, to consist of not more than 2000 words, by May 1, so that it may be circulated to members of the Conference.

The maximum time that can be allotted for the reading of any paper is twenty minutes, including illustrations. Discussion and questions will follow the papers. Those whose papers have previously been circulated will not be required to read them, but may instead present supplementary comments.

LANGUAGES

Papers should be read in English or French. German may also be used for the discussions.

WORKSHOPS AND DEMONSTRATIONS IN GHANAIAN MUSIC

It is planned to offer opportunities for practical studies in drumming and in instrumental and vocal styles.

FILMS AND RECORDINGS

Arrangements will be made to view films and hear recordings made by specialists attending the Conference.

SPECIAL MEETINGS

Meetings, with restricted participation, will be held of the Radio-television and Sound/Film Archives Committee, the Folk Dance Committee, and the Study Groups (Folk Song Texts, Folk Instruments, Comparative and Historical Research and Documentation, Folk Dance Terminology).

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

A meeting of the General Assembly of the International Folk Music Council will be held during the period of the Conference. Items for the Agenda must be received not later than May 1, 1966.

PERFORMANCES AND EXCURSIONS:

Performances of African music will be given by various groups in Accra, as well as at the various centres which will be visited during the Conference. Visits to musical events—traditional ceremonies and festivals—will also be arranged. There will be excursions to places of interest in and around Accra and Tema, to Aburi, the Volta Dam site, Cape Coast (central region) during the Conference.

POST CONFERENCE TOUR

Excursions to Kumasi, the Ashanti regional capital, will take place at the end of the main sessions of the Conference.

MEMBERSHIP

Participation in the Conference is open to members of the International Folk Music Council (annual membership £2, or \$6) on payment of an additional registration fee of £1 10s. or \$4.50.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is offered for all members of the Conference in the University Hall of Residence, where the Conference Sessions will be held.

The daily rates for room and full board (i.e., three meals) are approximately:

Single room in University Hall of Residence: 35/-

Single room with bath in Accra hotel: £3-£5 with breakfast

Double room with bath in Accra hotel: £5-£10 with breakfast

OTHER INFORMATION

The average temperature in Accra at this season over the past twenty years has been 76.2° F (24°C) with a maximum of 81.1° F (27°C) and a minimum of 70.2° F (21°C). There is likely to be some rain, probably in the form of showers.

Legon is about eight miles from Accra. Bus service will be planned to and from the airport for arrival and departure of members of the Conference.

VISAS

An Entry Permit is required for Ghana. Forms can be obtained at Embassies or High Commissions of Ghana.

Those who wish to attend the Conference are asked to fill in and return the attached registration and accommodation forms as soon as possible, in any case not later than May first.
